5 **Amendment (with title amendment)**

6 Remove lines 37-110 and insert:
7 benefit transfer card to purchase alcohol or tobacco products or
8 to use in, including accessing automatic teller machines located
9 in, gambling establishments and adult entertainment
10 establishments. This section does not prohibit the use of an
11 electronic benefit transfer card to access federal Supplemental
12 Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in any manner
13 authorized by federal law.

14 (2) If the Federal Government does not enact legislation
15 or regulations providing for dissemination of supplemental
16 security income by electronic benefit transfer, the state may
17 include supplemental security income in the electronic benefit
18 transfer program.

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19 ~~(3)~~(2) The department shall, in accordance with applicable
20 federal laws and regulations, develop minimum program
21 requirements and other policy initiatives for the electronic
22 benefit transfer program.

23 ~~(4)~~(3) The department shall enter into public-private
24 contracts for all provisions of electronic transfer of public
25 assistance benefits.

26 Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (13) of section
27 414.095, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

28 414.095 Determining eligibility for temporary cash
29 assistance.—

30 (13) METHODS OF PAYMENT OF TEMPORARY CASH ASSISTANCE.—
31 Temporary cash assistance may be paid as follows:

32 (a) Direct payment through state warrant, electronic
33 transfer of temporary cash assistance, electronic benefit
34 transfer card, or voucher. A cash assistance recipient may not:

35 1. Access cash benefits through an electronic benefit
36 transfer card from an automated teller machine in this state
37 located in:

38 a. An adult entertainment establishment as defined in s.
39 847.001.

40 b. A pari-mutuel facility as defined in s. 550.002.

41 c. A gaming facility authorized under a tribal-state
42 gaming compact under part II of chapter 285.

43 d. A commercial bingo facility that operates outside the
44 provisions of s. 849.0931.

45 e. A gambling establishment, including businesses referred
46 to as casino-style Internet cafes, convenience casinos, corner

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47 store casinos, gambling halls, game parlors, Internet gambling
48 café, Internet sweepstakes cafes, Internet sweepstakes parlors,
49 Internet sweepstakes rooms, low-end casinos, neighborhood
50 casinos, neighborhood gambling halls, pop-up casinos, simulated
51 gambling centers, simulated slots centers, storefront casinos,
52 strip mall casinos, sweepstakes casinos, sweepstakes parlors,
53 virtual slot machine cafes, or any such business ceteris
54 paribus.
