A bill to be entitled

An act relating to instruction in the public schools; creating s. 1003.4206, F.S.; authorizing each district school board to provide cyberbullying awareness instruction in K-12 public schools during the beginning of the school year; providing for designation of "Cyberbullying Awareness Week"; defining the term "cyberbullying"; providing for the integration of cyberbullying awareness instruction into existing curriculum and the goals of such instruction; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1003.4206, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1003.4206 Cyberbullying awareness instruction.—

(1) Each district school board may provide cyberbullying awareness instruction in all K-12 public schools in the district during the third week in September each year. The district school board shall designate the week as "Cyberbullying Awareness Week."

(2) (a) During this 1-week period, students may be provided intensive instruction to expand their knowledge, understanding, and awareness of cyberbullying. For purposes of this section, the term "cyberbullying" means the transmission of any electronic textual, visual, written, or oral communication with the malicious or willful intent to threaten, torment, abuse, or intimidate an individual.

(b) The instruction may be integrated into the existing school curriculum in ways including, but not limited to, supplementing lesson plans, holding school assemblies, or providing other school-related activities. The instruction shall be delivered by qualified school personnel or by knowledgeable guest speakers.

- (3) The goals of cyberbullying awareness instruction include:
- (a) Increased attention to identifying and preventing cyberbullying.
- (b) Awareness of the serious consequences of cyberbullying, including, but not limited to, the emotional pain or discomfort that cyberbullying may cause.
- (c) Ways in which to respond to cyberbullying, including reporting incidents of cyberbullying to school officials.
- (d) Awareness that incidents of cyberbullying which occur in school often continue to occur after school hours.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
