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138 (1) When the department issues or reissues a license for 139 the operation of motor vehicles to a person who has not attained 140 18 years of age, the department shall also issue to the person a 141 placard that can be placed in a motor vehicle so as to be 142 visible from the front and rear of the vehicle. Each side of the 143 placard shall have markings or color which shall be obviously 144 separate and distinct from all other placards issued by the 145 department and shall bear a warning that the person must display 146 the placard at all times while operating a motor vehicle. (2) A driver who has not attained 18 years of age must 147 148 display the placard issued under this section at all times while 149 operating a motor vehicle. The placard must be displayed so as 150 to be visible from the front and rear of the vehicle. 151 (3) A person who violates subsection (2) commits a 152 noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a nonmoving 153 violation as provided in chapter 318. 154 Section 6.
