(c) Zero-tolerance policies do not require the reporting of petty acts of misconduct and misdemeanors to a law enforcement agency, including, but not limited to, disorderly conduct, disrupting a school function, simple assault or battery, affray, theft of less than \$300, trespassing, and vandalism of less than \$1,000.

25 (d) The school principal shall ensure that all school 26 personnel are properly informed of as to their responsibilities 27 regarding crime reporting, that appropriate delinquent acts and 28 crimes are properly reported, and that actions taken in cases 29 with special circumstances are properly managed taken and documented. In addition, the school principal shall certify to 30 31 the superintendent, in writing, of the arrest of a student who 32 is under the jurisdiction of the district school board for an 33 act that poses a serious threat to school safety. 34
