Senator Bennett moved the following:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 1855 and 1856

insert:

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Section 19. Subsection (3) and paragraph (a) of subsection (4) of section 464.012, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

464.012 Certification of advanced registered nurse practitioners; fees.-

9 (3) An advanced registered nurse practitioner shall perform 10 those functions authorized in this section within the framework 11 of an established protocol that is filed with the board upon 12 biennial license renewal and within 30 days after entering into 13 a supervisory relationship with a physician or changes to the



14 protocol. The board shall review the protocol to ensure 15 compliance with applicable regulatory standards for protocols. The board shall refer to the department licensees submitting 16 17 protocols that are not compliant with the regulatory standards for protocols. A practitioner currently licensed under chapter 18 458, chapter 459, or chapter 466 shall maintain supervision for 19 20 directing the specific course of medical treatment. Within the 21 established framework, an advanced registered nurse practitioner 22 may:

23 (a) Order, administer, monitor, and alter any drug or drug 24 therapies that are necessary for the proper medical care and 25 treatment of a patient, including Schedule II through Schedule V 26 controlled substances under chapter 893 and those drugs agreed 27 upon by the advanced registered nurse practitioner and the 28 supervising practitioner and specified in the protocol. An 29 advanced registered nurse practitioner may order or administer 30 such drugs under the following conditions:

31 <u>1. The drugs are ordered or administered by an advanced</u> 32 <u>registered nurse practitioner in accordance with a protocol</u> 33 <u>developed by the advanced registered nurse practitioner and the</u> 34 <u>supervising practitioner, and the drugs ordered are consistent</u> 35 <u>with the advanced registered nurse practitioner's educational</u> 36 <u>preparation or for which clinical competency has been</u> 37 <u>established and maintained.</u>

38 <u>2. The protocol covering the order or administration of</u> 39 <u>drugs specifies the name of the advanced registered nurse</u> 40 <u>practitioner who may administer or order drugs, the drugs that</u> 41 <u>may be ordered and the circumstances under which they may be</u> 42 <u>ordered, the extent of the practitioner's supervision of the</u>

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43	advanced registered nurse practitioner, and the method for
44	periodic reviewing the advanced registered nurse practitioner's
45	competence, including peer review. The protocol for
46	administering Schedule II controlled substances must address the
47	illness, injury, or condition for which a Schedule II controlled
48	substance is administered.
49	3. The administering or ordering of drugs by an advanced
50	registered nurse practitioner occurs under practitioner
51	supervision. As used in this paragraph, the term "practitioner
52	supervision" means a collaboration between the advanced
53	registered nurse practitioner and the supervising practitioner
54	on the development of the protocol and the availability of the
55	supervising practitioner via telephonic contact at the time the
56	patient is examined by the advanced registered nurse
57	practitioner. The term does not mean that the physical presence
58	of the supervising practitioner is required. A practitioner may
59	not supervise more than four advanced registered nurse
60	practitioners at any one time.
61	4. The controlled substances are administered or ordered in
62	accordance with a patient-specific protocol approved by the
63	treating or supervising practitioner if Schedule II or Schedule
64	III controlled substances are administered or ordered by the
65	advanced registered nurse practitioner. A copy of the section of
66	the advanced registered nurse practitioner's protocol relating
67	to controlled substances must be provided upon request to the
68	licensed pharmacist who dispenses the drugs.
69	5. The board has certified that the advanced registered
70	nurse practitioner has satisfactorily completed:
71	a. At least 6 months of direct supervision in the

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72	administering and ordering of drugs; and
73	b. A course in pharmacology covering the order, use,
74	administration, and dispensing of controlled substances.
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76	The board shall adopt rules to administer this paragraph.
77	(b) Initiate appropriate therapies for certain conditions.
78	(c) Perform additional functions as may be determined by
79	rule in accordance with s. 464.003(2).
80	(d) Order diagnostic tests and physical and occupational
81	therapy.
82	(4) In addition to the general functions specified in
83	subsection (3), an advanced registered nurse practitioner may
84	perform the following acts within his or her specialty:
85	(a) The certified registered nurse anesthetist may, to the
86	extent authorized by established protocol approved by the
87	medical staff of the facility in which the anesthetic service is
88	performed, perform any or all of the following:
89	1. Determine the health status of the patient as it relates
90	to the risk factors and to the anesthetic management of the
91	patient through the performance of the general functions.
92	2. Based on history, physical assessment, and supplemental
93	laboratory results, determine, with the consent of the
94	responsible physician, the appropriate type of anesthesia within
95	the framework of the protocol.
96	3. Order under the protocol preanesthetic medication.
97	4. Perform under the protocol procedures commonly used to
98	render the patient insensible to pain during the performance of
99	surgical, obstetrical, therapeutic, or diagnostic clinical
100	procedures. These procedures include ordering and administering

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101 regional, spinal, and general anesthesia; inhalation agents and 102 techniques; intravenous agents and techniques; and techniques of 103 hypnosis. 104 5. Order or perform monitoring procedures indicated as 105 pertinent to the anesthetic health care management of the 106 patient. 107 6. Support life functions during anesthesia health care, 108 including induction and intubation procedures, the use of 109 appropriate mechanical supportive devices, and the management of 110 fluid, electrolyte, and blood component balances. 111 7. Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for 112 abnormal patient responses to anesthesia, adjunctive medication, or other forms of therapy. 113 114 8. Recognize and treat a cardiac arrhythmia while the 115 patient is under anesthetic care. 116 9. Participate in management of the patient while in the 117 postanesthesia recovery area, including ordering the administration of fluids and drugs, including those drugs that 118 119 are commonly used to alleviate pain. 120 10.
