An act relating to the issuance and renewal of driver's licenses and identification cards; creating s. 322.0805, F.S.; providing legislative intent; prohibiting the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles from copying and retaining certain verification documents of any United States citizens who is obtaining, renewing, or modifying a driver's license or identification card; limiting requirements to provide verification documents; requiring destruction of such documents received and retained by the department; exempting certain licensed persons or identification cardholders from requirements to provide proof of address; requiring the department to use existing records for identity verification for a normal renewal, reinstatement, or modification of a license or identification card; prohibiting the department from using certain standards for photographs, incorporating any electronic tracking device upon or within any driver's license or identification card, and obtaining fingerprints or biometric DNA material of citizens; allowing use of a nonresidential address for certain persons; providing for application; providing an effective date.

322.0805 Florida Driver's License Citizen Protection Act.-

- (1) It is the intent of the Legislature to minimize any inconvenience to citizens transacting business with the department while maintaining security for the issuance of driver's licenses and identification cards to citizens and aliens legally residing within the state.
- (2) (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department may not copy or retain in any form or format any document submitted by a United States citizen as proof of identification, proof of social security number, or proof of residence or any other verification document required or formerly required under this chapter for original issuance, normal renewal, reinstatement, or modification, such as an endorsement or address change, of a driver's license or identification card. Proof of citizenship required for issuance of an original driver's license or identification card may not be copied or retained by the department but shall be noted in the department's records when received and returned. Once established, proof of identity or citizenship may not be required by the department for renewal, reinstatement, or modification of a license or identification card. By September 11, 2012, the department shall securely destroy so as to make irretrievable any such verification documents that have been obtained from United States citizens.
- (b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, if a citizen is currently licensed to drive in this state or holds a valid Florida identification card, the department shall grant a normal renewal, reinstatement, or modification, such as an endorsement or address change, of the license or identification card in the

name already existing in the records of the department and the citizen may not be required by the department to provide further proof of identity. The department may not require a citizen who has held a valid Florida driver's license or a valid Florida identification card for at least 10 years to submit proof of his or her residence address for renewal of the license or identification card. In all cases, the department shall primarily use the existing photographs in its records as the best evidence for identification upon renewal or modification of a driver's license or identification card.

- international standard for the photographs required under this chapter and may not incorporate any radio frequency identification device, any device known as a RFID, or any similar electronic tracking device upon or within any driver's license or identification card issued. The department may not obtain any fingerprints or biometric DNA material from a United States citizen for purposes of any issuance, renewal, reinstatement, or modification of a driver's license or identification card.
- (4) A residential address is not required to be displayed on the driver's license or identification card of any person whose residential address is protected from disclosure by law in s. 119.071(4)(d) or s. 741.403.
- (5) This section does not prohibit the copying and retention of documents submitted by noncitizens when applying for a driver's license or identification card.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
