Subsection (6) of section 318.18, Florida 24 Statutes, is amended to read: 25 318.18 Amount of penalties.-The penalties required for a 26 noncriminal disposition pursuant to s. 318.14 or a criminal 27 offense listed in s. 318.17 are as follows: 28 One hundred dollars or the fine amount designated by (6)

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29 county ordinance, plus court costs for illegally parking, under 30 s. 316.1955, in a parking space provided for people who have 31 disabilities. 92 A confiscated permit must be held as evidence until a (b) 93 judicial decision about the violation has been made. After a finding of guilt has been made or a plea of nolo contendere has 94 95 been entered, the charging agency shall destroy the confiscated permit. A confiscated permit may not, under any circumstances, 96 be returned to its registered owner after a finding of guilt has 97 98 been made or a plea of nolo contendere has been entered in court. If a finding of guilt has been made or a plea of nolo 99 100 contendere has been entered for fraudulent or other unlawful use of a disabled parking permit after a prior finding of guilt or 101 102 plea of nolo contendere for fraudulent or other unlawful use of 103 a disabled parking permit issued to the same registered permit 104 owner, the permit owner may not apply for a new disabled parking 105 permit for a period of 4 years.
