3 **Amendment (with title amendment)**

4 Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

5 Section 1. Subsection (4) of section 1006.07, Florida
6 Statutes, is amended to read:

7 1006.07 District school board duties relating to student
8 discipline and school safety.—The district school board shall
9 provide for the proper accounting for all students, for the
10 attendance and control of students at school, and for proper
11 attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the
12 welfare of students, including:

13 (4) EMERGENCY DRILLS; EMERGENCY PROCEDURES.—

14 (a) Formulate and prescribe policies and procedures for
15 emergency drills and for actual emergencies, including, but not
16 limited to, fires, natural disasters, and bomb threats, for all
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17 the public schools of the district which comprise grades K-12.
18 District school board policies shall include commonly used alarm
19 system responses for specific types of emergencies and
20 verification by each school that drills have been provided as
21 required by law and fire protection codes. The emergency
22 response agency that is responsible for notifying the school
23 district for each type of emergency must be listed in the
24 district's emergency response policy.

25 (b) ~~The district school board shall~~ Establish model
26 emergency management and emergency preparedness procedures,
27 including emergency notification procedures pursuant to
28 paragraph (a), for the following life-threatening emergencies:

- 29 1. Weapon-use and hostage situations.
- 30 2. Hazardous materials or toxic chemical spills.
- 31 3. Weather emergencies, including hurricanes, tornadoes,
32 and severe storms.
- 33 4. Exposure as a result of a manmade emergency.

34 Section 2. Paragraph (i) of subsection (3) of section
35 1002.20, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

36 1002.20 K-12 student and parent rights.—Parents of public
37 school students must receive accurate and timely information
38 regarding their child's academic progress and must be informed
39 of ways they can help their child to succeed in school. K-12
40 students and their parents are afforded numerous statutory
41 rights including, but not limited to, the following:

42 (3) HEALTH ISSUES.—

43 (i) *Epinephrine use* and supply.—

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44 1. A student who has experienced or is at risk for life-
45 threatening allergic reactions may carry an epinephrine auto-
46 injector and self-administer epinephrine by auto-injector while
47 in school, participating in school-sponsored activities, or in
48 transit to or from school or school-sponsored activities if the
49 school has been provided with parental and physician
50 authorization. The State Board of Education, in cooperation with
51 the Department of Health, shall adopt rules for such use of
52 epinephrine auto-injectors that shall include provisions to
53 protect the safety of all students from the misuse or abuse of
54 auto-injectors. A school district, county health department,
55 public-private partner, and their employees and volunteers shall
56 be indemnified by the parent of a student authorized to carry an
57 epinephrine auto-injector for any and all liability with respect
58 to the student's use of an epinephrine auto-injector pursuant to
59 this paragraph.

60 2. A public school may maintain in a locked, secure
61 location on its premises a supply of epinephrine auto-injectors.
62 A physician may prescribe epinephrine auto-injectors in the name
63 of the school to be maintained for emergency use when any
64 student is having an anaphylactic reaction. The supply of
65 epinephrine auto-injectors may be provided to and used by any
66 student authorized to self-administer epinephrine by auto-
67 injector under subparagraph 1.

68 Section 3. Subsections (16) and (17) are added to section
69 1002.42, Florida Statutes, to read:

70 1002.42 Private schools.—

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71 (16) EMERGENCY PROCEDURES.—The emergency response agencies
72 that are identified in a district school board's emergency
73 response policy pursuant to s. 1006.07(4) and that are
74 responsible for notifying the school district of an occurrence
75 that threatens student safety shall also notify private schools
76 in the district that request such notification by opting into
77 the district school board's emergency notification procedures.

78 (17) EPINEPHRINE SUPPLY.—A private school may maintain in
79 a locked, secure location on its premises a supply of
80 epinephrine auto-injectors. A physician may prescribe
81 epinephrine auto-injectors in the name of the private school to
82 be maintained for emergency use when any student is having an
83 anaphylactic reaction. The supply of epinephrine auto-injectors
84 may be provided to and used by any student authorized to self-
85 administer epinephrine by auto-injector under s. 1002.20(3)(i).

86 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
