Subsection (2) of section 395.0191, Florida 20 Statutes, is amended to read: 21 395.0191 Staff membership and clinical privileges.-22 (2) (a) Each licensed facility shall establish rules and 23 procedures for consideration of an application for clinical 24 privileges submitted by an advanced registered nurse 25 practitioner licensed and certified under part I of chapter 464, in accordance with the provisions of this section. No licensed 26 facility shall deny such application solely because the 27 28 applicant is licensed under part I of chapter 464 or because the Page 1 of 3

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applicant is not a participant in the Florida Birth-RelatedNeurological Injury Compensation Plan.

31 An advanced registered nurse practitioner who is (b) 32 certified as a registered nurse anesthetist licensed under part 33 I of chapter 464 shall administer anesthesia under the onsite 34 medical direction of a professional licensed under chapter 458, 35 chapter 459, or chapter 466, and in accordance with an 36 established protocol approved by the medical staff.
