5 Section 1. Section 288.109, Florida Statutes, is amended

9 288.109 One-Stop Business Registration Portal.-

10 (1) By January 1, 2013, the Department of Revenue shall
11 establish and implement the One-Stop Business Registration
12 Portal that, through an Internet website, provides individuals
13 and businesses with a single point of entry for:

14 (a) Completing and submitting applications for various
15 licenses, registrations, or permits that must be issued by a

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16 state department or agency in order for the applicants to
17 transact business in the state.

18 (b) Filing various documents that must be filed with a
19 state department or agency in order for the filers to transact
20 business in the state.

21 (c) Remitting payment for various fees that must be paid
22 to a state department or agency, including, but not limited to,
23 application fees, license fees, registration fees, permit fees,
24 and filing fees.

25 (2) The Department of Revenue, after establishment of the
26 Internet website for the One-Stop Business Registration Portal,
27 shall implement, in the most timely manner practicable, the
28 capabilities described in subsection (1).

29 (3) The Department of Revenue may competitively procure
30 and contract for services to develop and maintain the Internet
31 website for the One-Stop Business Registration Portal.

32 (4) The following departments shall cooperate with the
33 Department of Revenue in the development and implementation of
34 the One-Stop Business Registration Portal:

35 (a) The Department of Business and Professional
36 Regulation.

37 (b) The Department of Economic Opportunity.

38 (c) The Department of Financial Services.

39 (d) The Department of the Lottery.

40 (e) The Department of Management Services.

41 (f) The Department of State.

42 (5) By January 1 of each year, beginning in 2013, the
43 Department of Revenue shall submit a report to the Governor, the
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44 President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
45 Representatives on the implementation of the One-Stop Business
46 Registration Portal. The report must include a complete and
47 detailed description of the department's activities and
48 accomplishments related to implementation of the One-Stop
49 Business Registration Portal during the previous calendar year.
50 The report must also include a plan for expansion of the One-
51 Stop Business Registration Portal to allow individuals and
52 businesses to submit applications through the portal for various
53 licenses, registrations, or permits issued by local governments.
54 The report may also include recommendations for improving the
55 effectiveness of the One-Stop Business Registration Portal and
56 increasing participation by state departments and agencies and
57 local governments.

58 (6) The Department of Revenue may provide information
59 relative to this section to each state department or agency and
60 local government that, in the conduct of its official duties,
61 participates in the One-Stop Business Registration Portal.
62 However, to the extent that such information is not otherwise
63 confidential, information collected from an individual or
64 business by a state department or agency or local government
65 does not become confidential solely because the information is
66 collected through the One-Stop Business Registration Portal.

67 (7) The Department of Revenue may adopt rules to
68 administer this section.

69 Section 2. Sections 288.1092, 288.1093, and 288.1095,
70 Florida Statutes, are repealed.

71 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.

An act relating to the One-Stop Business Registration Portal; amending s. 288.109, F.S.; directing the Department of Revenue to establish the One-Stop Business Registration Portal through which individuals and businesses may submit applications for various licenses, registrations, or permits, file various documents, or remit payment for various fees to a state department or agency; authorizing the department to contract for the development and maintenance of the portal's Internet website; requiring certain state departments to cooperate with the department in the development and implementation of the portal; requiring the department to submit an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature on the portal's implementation and expansion; authorizing the department to provide certain information relative to the One-Stop Business Registration Portal to certain state departments and agencies and local governments; authorizing the department to adopt rules; deleting provisions relating to the One-Stop Permitting System of the former State Technology Office, including provisions authorizing individuals and businesses to apply for certain state, regional, and local

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100 development permits through an Internet site developed
101 by the office; repealing ss. 288.1092, 288.1093, and
102 288.1095, F.S., relating to the One-Stop Permitting
103 System Grant Program and the award of grants to
104 counties that participate in the One-Stop Permitting
105 System, the Quick Permitting County Designation
106 Program and the designation of a county as a Quick
107 Permitting County, and the distribution of literature
108 explaining the One-Stop Permitting System and the
109 Quick Permitting County designations; providing an
110 effective date.
