SUMMARY ANALYSIS

HB 7011 passed the House on January 25, 2012, and passed the Senate on February 13, 2012. This reviser's bill replaces statutory references to the "Division of Forestry" with references to the "Florida Forest Service" pursuant to the Legislative directive to the Division of Statutory Revision in s. 12, ch. 2011-56, Laws of Florida.

Pursuant to Rule 12.3(e), a reviser's bill cannot be amended except to delete a bill section.

The bill has no fiscal impact.

The bill was approved by the Governor on February 24, 2012, ch. 2012-7, Laws of Florida. The bill becomes effective on the 60th day after adjournment sine die.

I. SUBSTANTIVE INFORMATION

A. EFFECT OF CHANGES:

This reviser's bill amends provisions of the Florida Statutes by substituting "Florida Forest Service" for the term "Division of Forestry" where the term appears in the Florida Statutes, pursuant to s. 12, ch. 2011-56, Laws of Florida. The bill amends the following statute chapters:

- Chapter 121, F.S., regarding the Florida Retirement System.
- Chapter 125, F.S., regarding County Government.
- Chapter 253, F.S., regarding State Lands.
- Chapter 258, F.S., regarding State Parks and Preserves.
- Chapter 259, F.S., regarding Land Acquisitions for Conservation or Recreation.
- Chapter 260, F.S., regarding the Florida Greenways and Trails Act.
- Chapter 261, F.S., regarding Off-Highway Vehicle Safety and Recreation.
- Chapter 317, F.S., regarding Off-Highway Vehicle Titling.
- Chapter 373, F.S., regarding Water Resources.
- Chapter 379, F.S., regarding Fish and Wildlife Conservation.
- Chapter 403, F.S., regarding Environmental Control.
- Chapter 479, F.S., regarding Outdoor Advertising.
- Chapter 581, F.S., regarding the Plant Industry.
- Chapter 589, F.S., regarding Forestry.
- Chapter 590, F.S., regarding Forest Protection.
- Chapter 591, F.S., regarding Forest Development.
- Chapter 633, F.S., regarding Fire Prevention and Control.
- Chapter 790, F.S., regarding Weapons and Firearms.
