When installing, uninstalling, or replacing solar panels 6 on one-family, two-family, or three-family residences, and the 7 local permitting agency's county or municipal government is 8 participating in a "United States Department of Energy SunShot 9 Initiative: Rooftop Solar Challenge" grant. However, an owner 10 must utilize a licensed electrical contractor to effectuate the 11 wiring of the solar panels, including any interconnection to the customer's residential electrical wiring. The limitations of 12 13 this exemption shall be expressly stated in the building permit

14 approved and issued by the permitting agency for such project. 15 (b) This subsection does not exempt any person who is 16 employed by or has a contract with such owner and who acts in 17 the capacity of a contractor. The owner may not delegate the owner's responsibility to directly supervise all work to any 18 other person unless that person is registered or certified under 19 this part and the work being performed is within the scope of 20 that person's license. For the purposes of this subsection, the 21 2.2 term "owners of property" includes the owner of a mobile home 23 situated on a leased lot.

24 (c) To qualify for exemption under this subsection, an 25 owner must personally appear and sign the building permit application and must satisfy local permitting agency 26 27 requirements, if any, proving that the owner has a complete understanding of the owner's obligations under the law as 28 29 specified in the disclosure statement in this section. However, for purposes of implementing a "United States Department of 30 Energy SunShot Initiative: Rooftop Solar Challenge" grant and 31 32 the participation of county and municipal governments, including 33 local permitting agencies under the jurisdiction of such county 34 and municipal governments, an owner's notarized signature or 35 personal appearance to sign the permit application is not 36 required for a solar project, as described in subparagraph 37 (a)3., if the building permit application is submitted 38 electronically to the permitting agency and the owner certifies 39 the application and disclosure statement using the permitting 40 agency's electronic confirmation system. If any person violates 41 the requirements of
