Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (4) of section 1003.453, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.453 School wellness and physical education policies; nutrition guidelines.—

(4) School districts are encouraged to provide basic training in first aid, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation, for all students, beginning in grade 6 and every 2 years thereafter. School districts that provide basic training in first aid, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation, which is based on a program that is nationally recognized and uses the most current national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines, shall require that students learn and practice the psychomotor skills associated with performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation at least one time before graduating from high school. For purposes of this subsection, the term "psychomotor skills" means the use of hands-on practice

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and skills testing to support cognitive learning. This term does
not include cognitive-only training. Private and public
partnerships for providing training or necessary funding are
encouraged.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
