6 Remove lines 69-96 and insert:

7 (2) A license that has become inactive under subsection  
8 (1) or for failure to complete the requirements in s. 473.312  
9 may be reactivated under s. 473.311 upon application to the  
10 department. The board may prescribe by rule continuing education  
11 requirements as a condition of reactivating a license. The  
12 minimum continuing education requirements for reactivating a  
13 license shall be those prescribed by board rule and those of the  
14 most recent biennium plus one-half of the requirements in s.  
15 473.312. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,  
16 the continuing education requirements are 120 hours, including  
17 at least 30 hours in accounting-related and auditing-related  
18 subjects, not more than 30 hours in behavioral subjects, and a  
19 minimum of 8 hours in ethics subjects approved by the board, for

20 the reactivation of a license that is inactive or delinquent on  
21 June 30, 2012 ~~2009~~, if the Florida certified public accountant  
22 notifies the Board of Accountancy by December 31, 2012 ~~2009~~, of  
23 an intention to reactivate such a license and completes such  
24 reactivation by June 30, 2014 ~~2011~~.

25 (3) A license that has become delinquent for failure to  
26 report completion of the requirements in s. 473.312 may be  
27 reactivated under s. 473.311 upon application to the department.  
28 Reactivation requires the payment of an application fee as  
29 determined by the board and certification by the Florida  
30 certified public accountant that the applicant satisfactorily  
31 completed the continuing education requirements set forth under  
32 s. 473.311. If the license is delinquent on December 31 because  
33 of failure to report completed continuing education  
34 requirements, the applicant must submit a complete application  
35 to the board by March 15 immediately following the delinquent  
36 period.
