Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (7) of section 440.107, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

440.107 Department powers to enforce employer compliance with coverage requirements.—

(7)

(d)1. In addition to any penalty, stop-work order, or injunction, the department shall assess against any employer who has failed to secure the payment of compensation as required by this chapter a penalty equal to 1.5, 1.75, or 2 times the amount the employer would have paid in premium when applying approved manual rates to the employer's payroll during periods for which it failed to secure the payment of workers' compensation required by this chapter within the preceding 1-year 3-year period or \$1,000, whichever is greater, as follows: for employers in violation of coverage requirements for less than 30 days in total, 1.5 times such amount; for employers in violation of coverage requirements for at least 30 days but less than 1 year in total, 1.75 times such amount; and for employers in violation of coverage requirements for 1 year in total, 2 times such amount.

2. Any subsequent violation within 5 years after the most recent violation shall, in addition to the penalties set forth in this subsection, be deemed a knowing act within the meaning of s. 440.105.
