- Section 1. Section 322.097, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 322.097 Teen Electronic Event Notification Service.-
- (1) Upon application and receipt of the appropriate fee from a parent or guardian of a person who has not attained 18 years of age and who holds a valid driver's license or learner's driver's license, the department shall notify the parent or guardian each time any of the following events is added to the person's driving record:
 - (a) Issuance of a traffic citation.
 - (b) Conviction for any traffic violation.
- (c) Suspension or revocation of the licensee's privilege to drive or driver's license.
 - (d) A vehicle crash.
- (2) Forms for applications under subsection (1) shall be as prescribed by the department.
 - (3) Notifications under subsection (1) shall be made
