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13	Section 1. Section 456.42, Florida Statutes, is amended to	
14	read:	
15	456.42 Written prescriptions for medicinal drugs	
16	(1) A written prescription for a medicinal drug issued by	
17	a health care practitioner licensed by law to prescribe such	
18	drug must <u>:</u>	
19	(a) Be legibly printed or typed so as to be capable of	
20	being understood by the pharmacist filling the prescription. $\cdot$	
21	(b) Include must contain the name of the prescribing	
22	practitioner.	
23	(c) Include the name and strength of the drug prescribed. $\tau$	
24	(d) Include the quantity of the drug prescribed. $_{ au}$	
25	(e) Include a legible, clear statement of the purpose for	
26	which the drug is being prescribed.	
27	(f) Include and the directions for use of the drug.;	
28	(g) must Be dated.; and	

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29 (h) must Be signed by the prescribing practitioner on the 30 day when issued.

However, A prescription that is electronically 31 (2) 32 generated and transmitted must:

33 Include contain the name of the prescribing (a) 34 practitioner.

35 Include the name and strength of the drug prescribed. $\overline{\tau}$ (b) 36 (c) Include the quantity of the drug prescribed in 37 numerical format.

Include a legible, clear statement of the purpose for 38 (d) 39 which the drug is being prescribed. and

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Include the directions for use of the drug. and must (e) Be dated and signed by the prescribing practitioner (f) 42 only on the day issued, which signature may be in an electronic format as defined in s. 668.003(4). 43

44 (3) (2) A written prescription for a controlled substance listed in chapter 893 must have the quantity of the drug 45 prescribed in both textual and numerical formats, must be dated 46 47 with the abbreviated month written out on the face of the prescription, and must be either written on a standardized 48 49 counterfeit-proof prescription pad produced by a vendor approved 50 by the department or electronically prescribed as that term is 51 used in s. 408.0611. As a condition of being an approved vendor, 52 a prescription pad vendor must submit a monthly report to the department which, at a minimum, documents the number of 53 prescription pads sold and identifies the purchasers. The 54 55 department may, by rule, require the reporting of additional 56 information.
