House Resolution

A resolution recognizing and commending the American Red Cross Volunteer Life Saving Corps on the occasion of its 100th anniversary.

6 WHEREAS, in March 1912, under the leadership of Dr. Lyman 7 G. Haskell, Clarence H. MacDonald, and Commodore Wilbert E. 8 Longfellow, Florida's first cadre unit of the United States 9 Volunteer Life Saving Corps (USVLSC) was established in 10 Jacksonville Beach, then called Pablo Beach, and

11 WHEREAS, on April 17, 1914, this USVLSC became the American 12 Red Cross Volunteer Life Saving Corps, Coast Guard Division One, 13 after being chartered by the American National Red Cross, and

WHEREAS, over the last 100 years, the Corps' volunteers have contributed over 1,290,000 hours of service, performed and recorded 1,430 life-saving rescues and 1,753 life-saving assists, and logged more than 25,000 first aid cases, and

18 WHEREAS, the American Red Cross Volunteer Life Saving Corps 19 is the last such life-saving organization still in continuous 20 operation in the United States, and

21 WHEREAS, the men and women of the American Red Cross 22 Volunteer Life Saving Corps have provided a century of 23 uninterrupted beach guard services on every Sunday and holiday 24 throughout the summer beach season along the beaches and waters 25 of Jacksonville Beach, and

26 WHEREAS, the American Red Cross Volunteer Life Saving Corps 27 has had a positive impact on both the community of Jacksonville
