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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 741.0307, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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741.0307 Marriage Education Committee; Florida Marriage Handbook.—

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(1) There is created the Marriage Education Committee, which shall consist of six marriage education and family advocates, two of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, two

providing an effective date.

29 of whom shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, and 30 two of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 31 Representatives. The committee shall be appointed by September 32 1, 2013, and the appointees shall serve a 1-year term each or 33 until such time as the Florida Marriage Handbook has been 34 created, whichever is earlier. The committee shall submit the 35 completed Florida Marriage Handbook to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 36 37 Representatives. The committee shall terminate with the 38 submission of the handbook. The committee shall subsequently be 39 reconstituted once every 10 years after July 1, 2013, to review 40 and update the contents of the Florida Marriage Handbook. The 41 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 42 House of Representatives shall each appoint two members to the 43 reconstituted committee. Any vacancy on the committee shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term in the same manner 44 as the original appointment. The committee is established within 45 46 the Department of Children and Families for administrative 47 purposes only.

- (2) The Marriage Education Committee shall create the Florida Marriage Handbook. The handbook shall provide resources, information, and skills to help a couple have a healthy and successful marriage. The handbook may include, but is not limited to:
- (a) Resources dealing with conflict resolution, communication skills, family expectations, financial responsibilities and management, domestic violence resources, and parenting responsibilities.

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(b) Current information from marriage education and family advocates to assist a couple in forming and maintaining a long-term marital relationship.

- (c) Information regarding premarital education, marriage enrichment education, and resources that are available to help restore a marriage that is potentially moving toward dissolution.
- (d) Contact information and website links to additional resources and local professional and community services to further assist a couple.
- (3) The Marriage Education Committee shall raise funds from private sources for the design and layout of the handbook and, if possible, to subsidize all or part of the printing and distribution costs.
- (4) The handbook shall be available from the clerk of the circuit court upon application for a marriage license. The clerk of the circuit court may also make the information in the handbook available through electronic media and is encouraged to provide a list of course providers and sites where marriage and relationship skill-building classes are available.
- (5) The Marriage Education Committee shall review the Florida Marriage Handbook and provide a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives every 10 years, or as soon thereafter as practicable, explaining changes made to the handbook and recommending further updates.
- Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 741.01, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

741.01 County court judge or clerk of the circuit court to issue marriage license; fee.—

- (1) (a) Every marriage license shall be issued by a county court judge or clerk of the circuit court under his or her hand and seal. The county court judge or clerk of the circuit court shall issue such license, upon application for the license, if there appears to be no impediment to the marriage. An application for a marriage license must allow both parties to the marriage to state under oath in writing if they are the parents of a child born in this state and to identify any such child they have in common by name, date of birth, place of birth, and, if available, birth certificate number. The name of any child recorded by both parties must be transmitted to the Department of Health along with the original marriage license and endorsements. The county court judge or clerk of the circuit court shall collect and receive a fee of \$2 for receiving the application for the issuance of a marriage license.
- (b) A marriage license application shall offer the applicants the opportunity to obtain an electronic copy of the Florida Marriage Handbook and shall have a space for one or both applicants to provide an e-mail address to receive the handbook. Upon receipt of the request, the clerk shall send an electronic copy of the handbook to the applicant within 14 days after the receipt of the request.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
