Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 812.0145, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 812.0145 Theft from persons 65 years of age or older; reclassification of offenses.—
- (2) Whenever a person is charged with committing theft from a person 65 years of age or older, when he or she knows or has reason to believe that the victim was 65 years of age or older, the offense for which the person is charged shall be reclassified as follows:
- (c) If the funds, assets, or property involved in the theft from a person 65 years of age or older is valued at \$300 or more, but less than \$10,000, the offender commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

Section 2. Section 825.101, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

825.101 Definitions.-As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Business relationship" means a relationship between two or more individuals or entities where there exists an oral or written contract or agreement for goods or services.
- (2) "Caregiver" means a person who has been entrusted with or has assumed responsibility for the care or the property of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult. "Caregiver" includes, but is not limited to, relatives, court-appointed or voluntary guardians, adult household members, neighbors, health care providers, and employees and volunteers of facilities as defined in subsection (4) $\frac{(7)}{(7)}$.
 - (3) "Deception" means:
 - (a) Misrepresenting or concealing a material fact relating

to:

1. Services rendered, disposition of property, or use of property, when such services or property are intended to benefit an elderly person or disabled adult;

- 2. Terms of a contract or agreement entered into with an elderly person or disabled adult; or
- 3. An existing or preexisting condition of any property involved in a contract or agreement entered into with an elderly person or disabled adult; or
- (b) Using any misrepresentation, false pretense, or false promise in order to induce, encourage, or solicit an elderly person or disabled adult to enter into a contract or agreement.
- (4) "Disabled adult" means a person 18 years of age or older who suffers from a condition of physical or mental incapacitation due to a developmental disability, organic brain damage, or mental illness, or who has one or more physical or mental limitations that restrict the person's ability to perform the normal activities of daily living.
- (5) "Elderly person" means a person 60 years of age or older who is suffering from the infirmities of aging as manifested by advanced age or organic brain damage, or other physical, mental, or emotional dysfunctioning, to the extent that the ability of the person to provide adequately for the person's own care or protection is impaired.
 - (3) (6) "Endeavor" means to attempt or try.
- (4) (7) "Facility" means any location providing day or residential care or treatment for vulnerable elderly persons or disabled adults. The term "facility" may include, but is not limited to, any hospital, training center, state institution,

nursing home, assisted living facility, adult family-care home, adult day care center, group home, mental health treatment center, or continuing care community.

- (5) (8) "Impaired" means any loss or abnormality of psychological, physiological, or anatomical structure or function due to a mental, emotional, sensory, long-term physical, or developmental disability or dysfunction, brain damage, or the infirmities of aging which results in a vulnerable adult's decreased ability to perform mental tasks and physical activities of daily living as defined in s. 415.102.

 "Intimidation" means the communication by word or act to an elderly person or disabled adult that the elderly person or disabled adult will be deprived of food, nutrition, clothing, shelter, supervision, medicine, medical services, money, or financial support or will suffer physical violence.
- (9) "Lacks capacity to consent" means an impairment by reason of mental illness, developmental disability, organic brain disorder, physical illness or disability, chronic use of drugs, chronic intoxication, short-term memory loss, or other cause, that causes an elderly person or disabled adult to lack sufficient understanding or capacity to make or communicate reasonable decisions concerning the elderly person's or disabled adult's person or property.
 - (6) (10) "Obtains or uses" means any manner of:
 - (a) Taking or exercising control over property; or
 - (b) Making any use, disposition, or transfer of property.
- (7)(11) "Position of trust and confidence" with respect to a vulnerable an elderly person or a disabled adult means the position of a person who:

(a) Is a parent, spouse, adult child, or other relative by blood or marriage of the <u>vulnerable</u> elderly person or disabled adult;

- (b) Is a joint tenant or tenant in common with the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult;
- (c) Has a legal or fiduciary relationship with the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult, including, but not limited to, a court-appointed or voluntary guardian, trustee, attorney, or conservator;
- (d) Is a caregiver of the <u>vulnerable</u> elderly person or disabled adult; or
- (e) Is any other person who has been entrusted with or has assumed responsibility for the use or management of the vulnerable elderly person's or disabled adult's funds, assets, or property.
 - (8) (12) "Property" means anything of value and includes:
- (a) Real property, including things growing on, affixed to, and found in land.
- (b) Tangible or intangible personal property, including rights, privileges, interests, and claims.
 - (c) Services.
- (9) (13) "Services" means anything of value resulting from a person's physical or mental labor or skill, or from the use, possession, or presence of property, and includes:
 - (a) Repairs or improvements to property.
 - (b) Professional services.
- (c) Private, public, or governmental communication, transportation, power, water, or sanitation services.
 - (d) Lodging accommodations.

(e) Admissions to places of exhibition or entertainment.

 $\underline{\text{(10)}}$ "Value" means value determined according to any of the following:

- (a)1. The market value of the property at the time and place of the offense or, if the market value cannot be satisfactorily ascertained, the cost of replacing the property within a reasonable time after the offense.
- 2. In the case of a written instrument such as a check, draft, or promissory note, which does not have a readily ascertainable market value, the value is the amount due or collectible. The value of any other instrument that creates, releases, discharges, or otherwise affects any valuable legal right, privilege, or obligation is the greatest amount of economic loss that the owner of the instrument might reasonably suffer by the loss of the instrument.
- 3. The value of a trade secret that does not have a readily ascertainable market value is any reasonable value representing the damage to the owner suffered by reason of losing advantage over those who do not know of or use the trade secret.
- (b) If the value of the property cannot be ascertained, the trier of fact may find the value to be not less than a certain amount; if no such minimum value can be ascertained, the value is an amount less than \$100.
- (c) Amounts of value of separate properties involved in exploitation committed pursuant to one scheme or course of conduct, whether the exploitation involves the same person or several persons, may be aggregated in determining the degree of the offense.
 - (11) "Vulnerable adult" means a person 18 years of age or

Section 3. Section 825.102, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

825.102 Abuse, aggravated abuse, and neglect of \underline{a} vulnerable \underline{an} elderly person or disabled adult; penalties.—

- (1) "Abuse of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult" means:
- (a) Intentional infliction of physical or psychological injury upon a vulnerable an elderly person or disabled adult;
- (b) An intentional act that could reasonably be expected to result in physical or psychological injury to <u>a vulnerable</u> an <u>elderly person or disabled</u> adult; or
- (c) Active encouragement of any person to commit an act that results or could reasonably be expected to result in physical or psychological injury to a vulnerable an elderly person or disabled adult.

A person who knowingly or willfully abuses <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult without causing great bodily harm, permanent disability, or permanent disfigurement to the <u>vulnerable</u> elderly person or disabled adult commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

- (2) "Aggravated abuse of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult" occurs when a person:
- (a) Commits aggravated battery on <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult;

(b) Willfully tortures, maliciously punishes, or willfully and unlawfully cages, <u>a vulnerable</u> and <u>elderly person or disabled</u> adult; or

(c) Knowingly or willfully abuses <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult and in so doing causes great bodily harm, permanent disability, or permanent disfigurement to the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult.

A person who commits aggravated abuse of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult commits a felony of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

(3) (a) "Neglect of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult" means:

1. A caregiver's failure or omission to provide <u>a</u> <u>vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult with the care, supervision, and services necessary to maintain the <u>vulnerable</u> elderly person's or disabled adult's physical and mental health, including, but not limited to, food, nutrition, clothing, shelter, supervision, medicine, and medical services that a prudent person would consider essential for the well-being of the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult; or

2. A caregiver's failure to make a reasonable effort to protect <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult from abuse, neglect, or exploitation by another person.

Neglect of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult may be based on repeated conduct or on a single incident or omission that results in, or could reasonably be expected to result in, serious physical or psychological injury, or a substantial risk

of death, to a vulnerable an elderly person or disabled adult.

- (b) A person who willfully or by culpable negligence neglects a vulnerable an elderly person or disabled adult and in so doing causes great bodily harm, permanent disability, or permanent disfigurement to the a vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (c) A person who willfully or by culpable negligence neglects a vulnerable an elderly person or disabled adult without causing great bodily harm, permanent disability, or permanent disfigurement to the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

Section 4. Section 825.1025, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 825.1025 Lewd or lascivious offenses committed upon or in the presence of <u>a vulnerable adult</u> an elderly person or disabled $\frac{1}{1}$ person.
- (1) As used in this section, "sexual activity" means the oral, anal, or vaginal penetration by, or union with, the sexual organ of another or the anal or vaginal penetration of another by any other object; however, sexual activity does not include an act done for a bona fide medical purpose.
- (2) (a) "Lewd or lascivious battery upon a vulnerable adult an elderly person or disabled person" occurs when a person encourages, forces, or entices a vulnerable adult an elderly person or disabled person to engage in sadomasochistic abuse, sexual bestiality, prostitution, or any other act involving sexual activity, when the person knows or reasonably should know

that the <u>vulnerable adult's ability elderly person or disabled</u>

person either lacks the capacity to consent <u>is impaired</u> or <u>the</u>

- (3) (a) "Lewd or lascivious molestation of <u>a vulnerable</u> <u>adult an elderly person or disabled person</u>" occurs when a person intentionally touches in a lewd or lascivious manner the breasts, genitals, genital area, or buttocks, or the clothing covering them, of <u>a vulnerable adult an elderly person or disabled person</u> when the person knows or reasonably should know that the <u>vulnerable adult's ability elderly person or disabled person either lacks the capacity</u> to consent <u>is impaired</u> or <u>the vulnerable adult fails</u> to give consent.
- (b) A person who commits lewd or lascivious molestation of a vulnerable adult an elderly person or disabled person commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (4) (a) "Lewd or lascivious exhibition in the presence of \underline{a} vulnerable adult an elderly person or disabled person" occurs when a person, in the presence of \underline{a} vulnerable adult an elderly person or disabled person:
 - 1. Intentionally masturbates;
- 2. Intentionally exposes his or her genitals in a lewd or lascivious manner; or
- 3. Intentionally commits any other lewd or lascivious act that does not involve actual physical or sexual contact with the

vulnerable adult elderly person or disabled person, including but not limited to, sadomasochistic abuse, sexual bestiality, or the simulation of any act involving sexual activity,

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when the person knows or reasonably should know that the vulnerable adult's ability elderly person or disabled person either lacks the capacity to consent or fails to give consent to having such act committed in his or her presence is impaired or the vulnerable adult fails to give consent.

300 (b) A person who commits a lewd or lascivious exhibition in the presence of a vulnerable adult an elderly person or disabled person commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

Section 5. Section 825.103, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

825.103 Exploitation of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult; penalties.—

- (1) "Exploitation of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult" means:
- (a) Knowingly, by deception or intimidation, obtaining or using, or endeavoring to obtain or use, the vulnerable an elderly person's or disabled adult's funds, assets, or property with the intent to temporarily or permanently deprive the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult of the use, benefit, or possession of the funds, assets, or property, or to benefit someone other than the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult, by a person who:
- 1. Stands in a position of trust and confidence with the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult; or

2. Has a business relationship with the <u>vulnerable</u> elderly person or disabled adult;

- (b) Obtaining or using, endeavoring to obtain or use, or conspiring with another to obtain or use a vulnerable an elderly person's or disabled adult's funds, assets, or property with the intent to temporarily or permanently deprive the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult of the use, benefit, or possession of the funds, assets, or property, or to benefit someone other than the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult, by a person who knows or reasonably should know that the vulnerable adult's ability elderly person or disabled adult lacks the capacity to consent is impaired; or
- (c) Breach of a fiduciary duty to <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult by <u>his or her</u> the person's guardian or agent under a power of attorney which results in an unauthorized appropriation, sale, or transfer of property.

- (c) If the funds, assets, or property involved in the exploitation of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult is valued at less than \$20,000, the offender commits a felony of

The presiding judge, after consideration of the age and health of the victim, may advance the trial on the docket. The motion may be filed and served with the information or charges or at any time thereafter.

- 1. The court finds in a hearing conducted outside the presence of the jury that the time, content, and circumstances of the statement provide sufficient safeguards of reliability. In making its determination, the court may consider the mental and physical age and maturity of the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult, the nature and duration of the abuse or offense, the relationship of the victim to the offender, the reliability of the assertion, the reliability of the vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult, and any other factor deemed appropriate; and
 - 2. The vulnerable elderly person or disabled adult either:
 - a. Testifies; or
- b. Is unavailable as a witness, provided that there is corroborative evidence of the abuse or offense. Unavailability shall include a finding by the court that the <u>vulnerable adult</u> is impaired, as defined in s. 825.101, or that the <u>vulnerable</u> elderly person's or disabled adult's participation in the trial or proceeding would result in a substantial likelihood of severe emotional, mental, or physical harm, in addition to findings pursuant to s. 90.804(1).

if it finds that:

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- 1. The defendant has previously been convicted as an adult three or more times for an offense in this state or other qualified offense that is:
 - a. Any forcible felony, as described in s. 776.08;
- b. Aggravated stalking, as described in s. 784.048(3) and (4);
 - c. Aggravated child abuse, as described in s. 827.03(2)(a);
- d. Aggravated abuse of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult, as described in s. 825.102(2);
- e. Lewd or lascivious battery, lewd or lascivious molestation, lewd or lascivious conduct, or lewd or lascivious exhibition, as described in s. 800.04 or s. 847.0135(5);
 - f. Escape, as described in s. 944.40; or
- g. A felony violation of chapter 790 involving the use or possession of a firearm.
- 2. The defendant has been incarcerated in a state prison or a federal prison.
- 3. The primary felony offense for which the defendant is to be sentenced is a felony enumerated in subparagraph 1. and was committed on or after October 1, 1995, and:
- a. While the defendant was serving a prison sentence or other sentence, or court-ordered or lawfully imposed supervision that is imposed as a result of a prior conviction for an enumerated felony; or
- b. Within 5 years after the conviction of the last prior enumerated felony, or within 5 years after the defendant's release from a prison sentence, probation, community control, control release, conditional release, parole, or court-ordered

or lawfully imposed supervision or other sentence that is imposed as a result of a prior conviction for an enumerated felony, whichever is later.

(1) In any case in which a person has been convicted of or has pled nolo contendere or guilty to, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld, any of the following offenses, or the attempt thereof, which offense or attempted offense involves the transmission of body fluids from one person to another:

(j) Section 825.102(1), relating to abuse of <u>a vulnerable</u> an elderly person or disabled adult;

(k) Section 825.102(2), relating to aggravated abuse of \underline{a} vulnerable \underline{an} elderly person or disabled adult;
