Any mental or psychological disorder or specific 27 learning disability. Any educational deficiency which substantially affects 28 2.

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29 a person's ability to read and comprehend the terms of any 30 contractual agreement entered into. 31 (d) "Major life activities" means functions associated 32 with the normal activities of independent daily living such as 33 caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, 34 hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, and working.
