A bill to be entitled

An act relating to elections; requiring a supervisor of elections to submit an election preparation report to the Secretary of State before a specified period prior to a general election; specifying the content of the report; requiring the Division of Elections of the Department of State to develop standards for measuring the performance of a supervisor of elections; requiring the publication of those reports; requiring the department to develop contract provision recommendations for supervisors of elections; establishing requirements; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. A supervisor of elections shall submit a report to the Secretary of State at least 3 months before a general election that outlines preparations for the upcoming general election. The report must include, at a minimum, the anticipated staffing levels of personnel during the early voting period, on election day, and after election day and the anticipated amount of automatic tabulating equipment that will be used at each early voting site and polling place.

Section 2. The Department of State shall work with supervisors of elections to establish performance standards to evaluate how successfully a supervisor conducts an election.

After an election cycle, the Division of Elections shall

evaluate each supervisor's performance and assign a letter grade of "A," "B," "C," "D," or "F" for that supervisor. The supervisors' grades shall be published on the division's website.

Section 3. The Department of State shall develop recommendations for supervisors of elections to assist a supervisor in negotiating contract provisions with a voting equipment vendor. The provisions shall include suggested time frames for a vendor to set up and test equipment before an election, the availability of a vendor to provide technical assistance to a supervisor during an early voting period and on the day of an election, as well as penalties for a vendor who fails to meet the terms of a contract.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
