5 (7) (6) "Election" means a any primary election, special 6 primary election, general election, special election, or 7 municipal election held in this state for the purpose of 8 nominating or electing candidates to public office, choosing 9 delegates to the national nominating conventions of political 10 parties, selecting a member of a political party executive committee, or submitting an issue to the electors for their 11 approval or rejection. 12



13 <u>(13)</u> (7) "Issue" means <u>a</u> any proposition <u>that</u> which is 14 required by the State Constitution, by law or resolution of the 15 Legislature, or by the charter, ordinance, or resolution of <u>a</u> 16 any political subdivision of this state to be submitted to the 17 electors for their approval or rejection at an election, or <u>a</u> 18 any proposition for which a petition is circulated in order to 19 have such proposition placed on the ballot at <u>an</u> any election.

20 <u>(14)(8)</u> "Person" means an individual or a corporation, 21 association, firm, partnership, joint venture, joint stock 22 company, club, organization, estate, trust, business trust, 23 syndicate, or other combination of individuals having collective 24 capacity. The term includes a political party, affiliated party 25 committee, <u>or</u> political committee, <u>or committee of continuous</u> 26 <u>existence</u>.

27 <u>(2) (9)</u> "Campaign treasurer" means an individual appointed 28 by a candidate or political committee as provided in this 29 chapter.

30 <u>(17) (10)</u> "Public office" means <u>a</u> any state, county, 31 municipal, or school or other district office or position <u>that</u> 32 which is filled by vote of the electors.

33 <u>(1) (11)</u> "Campaign fund raiser" means <u>an</u> <del>any</del> affair held to 34 raise funds to be used in a campaign for public office.

35 <u>(6) (12)</u> "Division" means the Division of Elections of the 36 Department of State.

37 <u>(4) (13)</u> "Communications media" means broadcasting stations, 38 newspapers, magazines, outdoor advertising facilities, printers, 39 direct mail, advertising agencies, the Internet, and telephone 40 companies; but with respect to telephones, an expenditure <u>is</u> 41 shall be deemed to be an expenditure for the use of



42 communications media only if made for the costs of telephones, 43 paid telephonists, or automatic telephone equipment to be used 44 by a candidate or a political committee to communicate with potential voters but excluding the any costs of telephones 45 incurred by a volunteer for use of telephones by such volunteer; 46 47 however, with respect to the Internet, an expenditure is shall 48 be deemed an expenditure for use of communications media only if 49 made for the cost of creating or disseminating a message on a 50 computer information system accessible by more than one person 51 but excluding internal communications of a campaign or of any 52 group.

53 (11)(14) "Filing officer" means the person before whom a 54 candidate qualifies, or the agency or officer with whom a 55 political committee or an electioneering communications 56 organization registers, or the agency by whom a committee of 57 continuous existence is certified.

58 (18) (15) "Unopposed candidate" means a candidate for 59 nomination or election to an office who, after the last day on 60 which a any person, including a write-in candidate, may qualify, 61 is without opposition in the election at which the office is to 62 be filled or who is without such opposition after such date as a 63 result of a any primary election or of withdrawal by other candidates seeking the same office. A candidate is not an 64 65 unopposed candidate if there is a vacancy to be filled under s. 66 100.111(3), if there is a legal proceeding pending regarding the 67 right to a ballot position for the office sought by the 68 candidate, or if the candidate is seeking retention as a justice 69 or judge.

(3) (16) "Candidate" means <u>a</u> any person to whom any <del>one or</del>
