Section 1. Paragraphs (h), (i), (j), (k), (l), (m), and (n) are added to subsection (3) of section 893.03, Florida Statutes, to read:

8 893.03 Standards and schedules.—The substances enumerated 9 in this section are controlled by this chapter. The controlled 10 substances listed or to be listed in Schedules I, II, III, IV, 11 and V are included by whatever official, common, usual, 12 chemical, or trade name designated. The provisions of this



13 section shall not be construed to include within any of the 14 schedules contained in this section any excluded drugs listed 15 within the purview of 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.22, styled "Excluded 16 Substances"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.24, styled "Exempt Chemical 17 Preparations"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.32, styled "Exempted 18 Prescription Products"; or 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.34, styled "Exempt 19 Anabolic Steroid Products."

20 (3) SCHEDULE III.-A substance in Schedule III has a 21 potential for abuse less than the substances contained in 22 Schedules I and II and has a currently accepted medical use in 23 treatment in the United States, and abuse of the substance may 24 lead to moderate or low physical dependence or high 25 psychological dependence or, in the case of anabolic steroids, 26 may lead to physical damage. The following substances are controlled in Schedule III: 27

(a) Unless specifically excepted or unless listed in
another schedule, any material, compound, mixture, or
preparation which contains any quantity of the following
substances having a depressant or stimulant effect on the
nervous system:
