Perform under the protocol procedures commonly used to 33 render the patient insensible to pain during the performance of 34 surgical, obstetrical, therapeutic, or diagnostic clinical 35 procedures. These procedures include ordering and administering 36 regional, spinal, and general anesthesia; inhalation agents and 37 techniques; intravenous agents and techniques; and techniques of hypnosis. 38 39 5. Order or perform monitoring procedures indicated as 40 pertinent to the anesthetic health care management of the 41 patient. 42 6. Support life functions during anesthesia health care, 43 including induction and intubation procedures, the use of 44 appropriate mechanical supportive devices, and the management of 45 fluid, electrolyte, and blood component balances. 7. Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for 46 47 abnormal patient responses to anesthesia, adjunctive medication, or other forms of therapy. 48 8. Recognize and treat a cardiac arrhythmia while the 49 50 patient is under anesthetic care. 51 9. Participate in management of the patient while in the 52 postanesthesia recovery area, including ordering the 53 administration of fluids and drugs. 10. Place special peripheral and central venous and 54 55 arterial lines for blood sampling and monitoring as appropriate. 56 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.

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
