A bill to be entitled

An act relating to homestead property tax exemptions; amending s. 196.082, F.S.; deleting a requirement that a disabled veteran be a resident of this state at the time of entering military service in order to receive a discount on the ad valorem tax owed on his or her homestead property; providing for retroactivity; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 196.082, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

196.082 Discounts for disabled veterans.-

- (1) Each veteran who is age 65 or older and is partially or totally permanently disabled shall receive a discount from the amount of the ad valorem tax otherwise owed on homestead property that the veteran owns and resides in if:
 - (a) The disability was combat-related;
- (b) The veteran was a resident of this state at the time of entering the military service of the United States; and
- (b) (c) The veteran was honorably discharged upon separation from military service.
- (3) To qualify for the discount granted under this section, an applicant must submit to the county property appraiser by March 1:
- (a) Proof of residency at the time of entering military service:
 - (a) (b) An official letter from the United States Department

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of Veterans Affairs which states the percentage of the veteran's service-connected disability and evidence that reasonably identifies the disability as combat-related;

(b) (c) A copy of the veteran's honorable discharge; and (c) (d) Proof of age as of January 1 of the year to which the discount applies will apply.

An Any applicant who is qualified to receive a discount under this section and who fails to file an application by March 1 may file an application for the discount and may file, pursuant to s. 194.011(3), a petition with the value adjustment board requesting that the discount be granted. Such application and petition \underline{is} shall be subject to the same procedures as \underline{for} exemptions \underline{under} \underline{set} \underline{forth} \underline{in} s. 196.011(8).

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013, and operate retroactively to January 1, 2013.
