10	(a) DEFINITIONSAs used in this subsection, the term:
11	1. "Certified surgical assistant" means a surgical
12	assistant who maintains valid and active one of the following
13	certifications:
14	a. Certified Surgical First Assistant from the National
15	Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting.
16	b. Certified Surgical Assistant from the National Surgical
17	Assistant Association.
18	c. Surgical Assistant-Certified from the American Board of
19	Surgical Assistants.
20	2. "Certified surgical technologist" means a surgical
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21	technologist who maintains valid and active certification as a
22	Certified Surgical Technologist from the National Board of
23	Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting.
24	3. "Surgeon" means any health care practitioner as defined
25	in chapter 456 whose scope of practice includes performing
26	surgery and who is listed as the primary surgeon in the
27	operative record.
28	4. "Surgical assistant" means a person providing aid under
29	the supervision of a surgeon in exposure, hemostasis, closures,
30	and other intra-operative technical functions that assist the
31	surgeon in performing a safe operation with optimal results for
32	the patient.
33	5. "Surgical technologist" means a person who assists and
34	practices under the supervision of a surgeon to ensure that the
35	operating room environment is safe, that proper equipment is
36	available, and that the operative procedure is conducted
37	efficiently. Surgical technologist duties include, but are not
38	limited to, maintaining sterility during a surgical procedure,
39	handling and ensuring the availability of necessary equipment
40	and supplies, and maintaining visibility of the operative site.
41	(b) EMPLOYMENT LIMITATIONS
42	1. A facility may not employ or contract with any person to
43	perform the duties of a surgical assistant unless the person is
44	a certified surgical assistant.
45	2. A facility may not employ or contract with any person to
46	perform the duties of a surgical technologist unless the person
47	is a certified surgical technologist.
48	3. Subparagraphs 1. and 2. do not apply to:
49	a. A person who was employed or contracted to perform the
50	duties of a surgical technologist or a surgical assistant at any
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51	time between January 1, 2013, and July 1, 2013.
52	b. Any health care practitioner as defined in chapter 456
53	or any student, if the duties he or she performs fall within the
54	scope of the practitioner's or the student's training and
55	practice.
56	c. Any person enrolled in a surgical technology or surgical
57	assisting training program accredited by the Commission on
58	Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs, the
59	Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools, or another
60	accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of
61	Education, on July 1, 2013. A person may practice as a surgical
62	technologist or a surgical assistant for one year after
63	completion of such a training program before he or she is
64	required to meet the criteria in subparagraphs 1. or 2.
