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29 DEFINITIONS.-As used in this section, the term: (2) "Full-time other-personal-services employees" means 30 (C) 31 employees of all branches and agencies of state government and 32 state universities that are classified as other-personal-33 services employees and are also "full-time" as defined in the 34 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, 35 124 Stat. 119, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152, 124 Stat. 1029, 36 37 and any regulations adopted pursuant to those federal acts.

"Full-time state employees" includes all full-time 38 (d)(c) 39 employees of all branches or agencies of state government 40 holding salaried positions and paid by state warrant or from 41 agency funds, and employees paid from regular salary 42 appropriations for 8 months' employment, including university 43 personnel on academic contracts. Except as provided in paragraph (c), but in no case shall "state employee" or "salaried 44 position" does not include persons paid from other-personal-45 services (OPS) funds. "Full-time employees" includes all full-46 time employees of the state universities. 47

48 (g) (f) "Part-time state employee" means any employee of 49 any branch or agency of state government paid by state warrant 50 from salary appropriations or from agency funds, and who is 51 employed for less than the normal full-time workweek established 52 by the department or, if on academic contract or seasonal or 53 other type of employment which is less than year-round, is 54 employed for less than 8 months during any 12-month period, but in no case shall "part-time" employee include a person paid from 55 56 other-personal-services (OPS) funds. "Part-time state employee"

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57 includes any part-time employee of the state universities. <u>Full-</u> 58 <u>time other-personal-services employees are not part-time state</u> 59 employees.

(3) STATE GROUP INSURANCE PROGRAM.-

61 (f) Except as provided for in subparagraph (h)2., the 62 state contribution toward the cost of any plan in the state group insurance program shall be uniform with respect to all 63 64 state employees in a state collective bargaining unit 65 participating in the same coverage tier in the same plan. This 66 section does not prohibit the development of separate benefit plans for officers and employees exempt from the career service, 67 68 or the development of separate benefit plans for each collective 69 bargaining unit, or the development of a separate benefit plan 70 for full-time other-personal-services employees.
