A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Statewide K-12 Education

Commission; creating the Statewide K-12 Education
Commission within the Department of Education to
streamline and improve the state's education system;
providing commission membership and duties; requiring
the commission to submit an annual report to the
Governor, the Legislature, and the State Board of
Education; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. (1) The Statewide K-12 Education Commission is created within the Department of Education for the purpose of streamlining the various processes within, and improving the efficiency of, the state's education system in carrying out the intent of Article IX of the State Constitution.
- (2) (a) The Statewide K-12 Education Commission shall consist of 21 members who shall be appointed to 4-year terms as follows:
 - 1. Four members appointed by the Governor.
 - 2. Four members appointed by the President of the Senate.
- 3. Four members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - 4. Nine members appointed by the State Board of Education.
- (b) At least 11 members of the commission shall be individuals currently employed by the school districts, including administrators, distributed proportionately among

small, medium, and large school districts. Members who are instructors in academic and vocational areas shall represent elementary schools, middle schools, high schools, and postsecondary education institutions. The remaining 10 members of the commission shall include retired educators, parents, employees of nonpublic schools and charter schools, community advocates of educational programs, and district school board members.

- (3) Members of the commission shall elect a chair and vice chair at the first meeting. The commission shall meet at least four times per year. Subject to appropriations provided in the General Appropriations Act, members of the commission are entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (4) The commission shall review all aspects of the delivery of education in the state, including, but not limited to, administration, assessment, budget, community support, parental involvement, curriculum, English for speakers of other languages, exceptional student education, facilities, noninstructional personnel, scheduling, student education and involvement, and teacher or instructional support. During the first year, the commission shall focus on educator performance and evaluation, assessment and alternative measures for evaluating student performance, curriculum, and student safety and welfare, including the prevention of bullying and the strengthening of student mental health.
- (5) Beginning June 1, 2014, and each year thereafter, the commission shall submit a report to the Governor, the President
