A bill to be entitled

An act relating to consumer protection; creating s. 501.20795, F.S.; requiring retail tire dealers to disclose to purchasers the date of manufacture of used tires and certain warnings relating to the age of tires; requiring the dealer to provide a copy of the disclosure to the purchaser and retain the original for a specified period; providing applicability; providing for enforcement by administrative action of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; providing for administrative fines; specifying that the provisions of the act are not enforceable by private action; providing for deposit and use of fines collected; requiring the Department of Legal Affairs to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 501.20795, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

501.20795 Disclosure of age of used tires sold by retail tire dealers.—

(1) (a) A retail tire dealer selling a used passenger or light truck tire shall, before dismounting the tire to be replaced by the used tire, before mounting the used tire, or at the time of sale, whichever occurs first, provide the purchaser with a written disclosure of the age of the used tire.

(b) The disclosure must include:

1. The week and year that the tire was manufactured.

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2. The statement, "Passenger and light truck tires, including spare tires and tires that are stored or have had little or no use, deteriorate as they age and are more prone to sudden failure that can cause a crash. Heat caused by hot climates or frequent high-loading conditions can accelerate the aging process. Most vehicle manufacturers recommend that passenger or light truck tires be replaced after 6 years, regardless of the remaining tread depth."

- (c) The disclosure must be initialed and dated by the purchaser. The dealer shall provide a copy of the disclosure to the purchaser and retain the original for at least 3 years.
  - (2) This section does not:
- (a) Affect any rights or duties provided under other applicable laws.
- (b) Apply to the private sale of used tires or tires on used vehicles.
- (3) The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services may enforce this section through administrative action with a fine of not more than \$250 for each violation. This section is not enforceable by private action.
- (4) All fines collected under this section shall be deposited into the General Inspection Trust Fund and used to pay expenses incurred in the enforcement of this section.
- (5) The department shall adopt rules to administer this section.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
