An act relating to the use of wireless communications devices while operating a motor vehicle; creating s. 316.3035, F.S.; defining the term "wireless communications device"; providing exceptions to the applicability of the act; providing that a person who causes the death of another person while operating a motor vehicle and using a wireless communications device commits vehicular homicide; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 316.3035, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
316.3035 Death caused by motor vehicle operator using wireless communications devices; vehicular homicide.-
(1) As used in this section, the term "wireless communications device" means any device that is designed or intended to receive or transmit text or character-based messages, to access or store data, or to connect to the Internet or any communications service as defined in s. 812.15 which allows text communications.
(2) This section does not apply to a person using a wireless communications device for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.
(3) A person who causes the death of a person while
