2	An act relating to school curriculum; providing a

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16	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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18	Section 1. Micro-credits pilot project
19	(1) As used in this section, the term "micro-credit" means
20	a fraction of a traditional course credit hour which is earned
21	through activities or experiences that culminate in educational
22	gain comparable to the amount that would be achieved in a
23	traditional classroom setting. Such activities include, but are
24	not limited to, self-directed study, reading, attending
25	seminars, viewing documentaries, and other life experiences.
26	Micro-credits are accumulated and, upon reaching a specified
27	number of micro-credits, total one traditional course credit
28	hour.
29	(2)(a) The Department of Education shall determine a school

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30	district within which a micro-credit pilot project is to be
31	administered for 2 years beginning July 1, 2014, unless
32	otherwise approved by the Legislature. The department shall
33	establish rules governing the issuance of micro-credits by the
34	school district.
35	(b) The district shall determine, based on rules adopted by
36	the department, the micro-credit activities that will be
37	accepted within the school district and shall make publicly
38	available a catalog of the activities and their micro-credit
39	value, as well as the micro-credits required to achieve a
40	traditional credit hour.
41	(c) The pilot project must, at a minimum, provide for the
42	following:
43	1. Testing of the various types of activities to determine
44	educational gain by an assessment of at least 10 questions but
45	not more than 30 questions per micro-credit.
46	2. A diverse range of activities for micro-credit gain
47	within each subject field.
48	3. Various activities for micro-credit gain within each
49	subject field to provide maximum options for a student.
50	4. A student-oriented format to maximize student
51	independence and flexibility.
52	(d) The pilot project may:
53	1. Incorporate public libraries, existing school
54	facilities, or institutions of higher learning.
55	2. Allow for students participating in the pilot project to
56	acquire micro-credits at any time within or outside the academic
57	year.
58	3. Develop an articulation model to transition micro-

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59	credits into traditional credits within the district schools.
60	(3) The Department of Education, the State Board of
61	Education, and the Board of Governors of the State University
62	System shall study the potential of implementing a micro-credit
63	system statewide, including the option of micro-credits for
64	enrolled postsecondary education students or accepting micro-
65	credits from high school students who apply for admission. By
66	July 1, 2015, the department and boards shall assess the
67	progress made in the pilot project, release their respective
68	findings, and produce model legislation for the implementation
69	of a micro-credit system statewide.
70	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
