(1) To ensure that public school students in this state have access to high-quality, evidence-based school counseling programs and to support the funding of additional school counselor positions in the public schools where the positions are needed, the Blue Ribbon Panel Task Force is established within the Department of Education. The purpose of the task force is to study whether there is a demonstrable relationship between expanding counseling resources in public schools and early detection of mental health issues in students, improved academic performance and student attendance, higher graduation

- (a) A member from one of the regional workforce boards from Workforce Florida, Inc., appointed by the Governor.
- (b) A principal, or the principal's designee, of a public school that received the Recognized-ASCA-Model-Program (RAMP) designation from the American School Counselor Association (ASCA), appointed by the Commissioner of Education.
- (c) A member of a parent-teacher organization or parent-teacher association in this state, appointed by the Commissioner of Education.

(d) The president of the governing board of the Florida School Counselor Association, or his or her designee.

- (e) The president of the ASCA, or his or her designee.
- (f) The chair of the board of directors of the Education Foundation of Collier County, Inc., also trademarked as Champions for Learning, or his or her designee.
- (g) A school administrator in this state, appointed by the Commissioner of Education.
- (h) A member of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate.
- (i) A member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- (3) The appointments to the task force must be completed by August 1, 2014. The task force shall hold its initial meeting by October 1, 2014, and elect a chair and vice chair. A vacancy in the office of chair or vice chair shall be filled by a vote of the remaining members.
 - (4) The task force shall:

- (a) Subject to legislative appropriation, use funds appropriated to the Department of Education to study whether increasing the number of certified school counselors in the public schools is demonstrably beneficial to students and to recommend a methodology for assessing the impact of such increased staffing.
- (b) Review and recommend updates to Florida's School Counseling and Guidance Framework for the enhancement of

- (5) The Department of Education shall provide staff and administrative support to the task force.
- (6) The task force shall meet quarterly and at other times at the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of task force members.
- (7) Five members of the task force constitute a quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members present is required for final action.
- (8) Members of the task force shall serve without compensation. Members are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (9) (a) By December 15, 2016, the task force shall submit a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives which states the task force's:
- 1. Findings, conclusions, and recommendations regarding the study described in paragraph (4)(a); and
- 2. Recommended updates for Florida's School Counseling and Guidance Framework as provided in paragraph (4)(b).
- (b) The task force terminates upon submission of the report.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
