111 It is the intent of the Legislature that every (1)112 applicant for an original driver's license in this state be 113 required to pass an examination pursuant to this section. However, the department may waive the knowledge, endorsement, 114 115 and skills tests for an applicant who is otherwise qualified, except for an applicant who provides proof of identity under s. 116 322.08(2)(c)9., s. 322.08(2)(c)10., or s. 322.08(2)(c)11., and 117 118 who surrenders a valid driver's license from another state or a 119 province of Canada, or a valid driver's license issued by the 120 United States Armed Forces, if the driver applies for a Florida 121 license of an equal or lesser classification.
