

House Joint Resolution

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 2 of Article I of the State Constitution to delete a provision authorizing laws that regulate or prohibit the ownership, inheritance, disposition, and possession of real property by aliens ineligible for citizenship.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the following amendment to Section 2 of Article I of the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose:

ARTICLE I

DECLARATION OF RIGHTS

SECTION 2. Basic rights.—All natural persons, female and male alike, are equal before the law and have inalienable rights, among which are the right to enjoy and defend life and liberty, to pursue happiness, to be rewarded for industry, and to acquire, possess, and protect property; ~~except that the ownership, inheritance, disposition and possession of real property by aliens ineligible for citizenship may be regulated or prohibited by law.~~ No person shall be deprived of any right because of race, religion, national origin, or physical disability.

29 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

30 ARTICLE I, SECTION 2

31 DECLARATION OF RIGHTS.—This amendment to the State
32 Constitution eliminates authority granted to the Legislature by
33 a constitutional amendment adopted in 1926 that allowed the
34 Legislature to regulate or eliminate the real property rights of
35 aliens ineligible for citizenship. The State Constitution will
36 now provide that all natural persons are equal before the law
37 and have an inalienable right to acquire, possess, and protect
38 property, without exception.
