Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 1012.71, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

(3) From the funds allocated to each school district and any funds received from local contributions for the Florida Teachers Classroom Supply Assistance Program, each the district school board shall issue each classroom teacher a debit card to purchase materials and supplies.

(a) The debit card shall be in the following amounts:

1. For a classroom teacher at an elementary school, at least \$250;

2. For a classroom teacher at a middle school, at least \$500; or

3. For a classroom teacher at a high school, at least \$750 calculate an identical amount for each classroom teacher, which is that teacher's proportionate share of the total amount allocated to the district from state funds and funds received

from local contributions.

(b) If additional funding is available, a district school board may, at any time during the school year, provide additional funds on a debit card above the minimum amounts in paragraph (a).

- (c) A job-share classroom teacher may receive a debit card that has a prorated share of the amount provided to a full-time classroom teacher.
- (d) The district school board and each charter school board shall provide each classroom teacher with a debit card 2 weeks before the start of the school year his or her total proportionate share by September 30 of each year by any means determined appropriate by the district school board or charter school board, including, but not limited to, direct deposit, check, debit card, or purchasing card. If a debit card is used, An identifier must be placed on the front of the debit card which clearly indicates that the card has been issued for the Florida Teachers Classroom Supply Assistance Program.
- (e) Expenditures under the program are not subject to state or local competitive bidding requirements. Funds received by a classroom teacher do not affect wages, hours, or terms and conditions of employment and, therefore, are not subject to collective bargaining. Any classroom teacher may decline receipt of or return the funds without explanation or cause.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
