Funds received by the Astronauts 44 Memorial Foundation, Inc., may be used for administrative costs 45 directly associated with the operation of the center and the 46 memorial institute. These funds must be used for the maintenance 47 and support of the operations of the Center for Space Education 48 and the Space Mirror Memorial Education Technology Institute 49 operated by the Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc.
