18	(a) A three-member panel is created, consisting of the
19	Chief Financial Officer, or the Chief Financial Officer's
20	designee, and two members to be appointed by the Governor,
21	subject to confirmation by the Senate, one member who, on
22	account of present or previous vocation, employment, or
23	affiliation, shall be classified as a representative of
24	employers, the other member who, on account of previous
25	vocation, employment, or affiliation, shall be classified as a
26	representative of employees. The panel shall determine statewide
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27 schedules of maximum reimbursement allowances for medically 28 necessary treatment, care, and attendance provided by physicians, hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, work-29 30 hardening programs, pain programs, and durable medical 31 equipment. The maximum reimbursement allowances for inpatient 32 hospital care shall be based on a rate of up to 140 percent of 33 the Medicare inpatient prospective payment system a schedule of 34 per diem rates, to be approved by the three-member panel no 35 later than October 1st of each year for the following calendar 36 year March 1, 1994, to be used in conjunction with a 37 precertification manual as determined by the department, 38 including maximum hours in which an outpatient may remain in 39 observation status, which shall not exceed 23 hours. No later 40 than October 1st of each year for the following calendar year, 41 the three-member panel must approve all compensable charges for 42 hospital outpatient care, which shall be reimbursed at up to 140 43 percent of the Medicare outpatient prospective payment system 75 percent of usual and customary charges, except as otherwise 44 45 provided by this subsection. Annually, the three-member panel 46 shall adopt schedules of maximum reimbursement allowances for 47 physicians, hospital inpatient care, hospital outpatient care, 48 ambulatory surgical centers, work-hardening programs, and pain programs. An individual physician, hospital, ambulatory surgical 49 center, pain program, or work-hardening program shall be 50 51 reimbursed either the agreed-upon contract price or the maximum 52 reimbursement allowance in the appropriate schedule. (b) It is the intent of the Legislature to increase the schedule of maximum reimbursement allowances for selected physicians effective January 1, 2004, and to pay for the increases through reductions in payments to hospitals. Revisions developed pursuant to this subsection are limited to the following:

Payments for outpatient physical, occupational, and
speech therapy provided by hospitals shall be reduced to the
schedule of maximum reimbursement allowances for these services
which applies to nonhospital providers.
