(b) To <u>a any</u> female <u>younger than under the age of</u> 18 years <u>of age</u>, but at least 16 years of age, and <u>a male older than over the age of</u> 18 years <u>of age</u> upon the female's application sworn under oath that she is an expectant parent.

(4)  $\underline{A}$  No license to marry  $\underline{may}$  not  $\underline{shall}$  be granted to  $\underline{a}$   $\underline{any}$  person  $\underline{younger}$  than  $\underline{under}$  the  $\underline{age}$  of 16 years  $\underline{of}$   $\underline{age}$ , with or without the consent of the parents, except as provided in  $\underline{subsections}$  (2) and (3).
