A bill to be entitled

An act relating to college and career readiness; creating s. 1003.4991, F.S.; requiring each school district to offer high school students a college and career readiness course; providing course requirements; requiring students to take an interest assessment and develop a curriculum plan before taking the course; specifying components of the course curriculum and activities; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1003.4991, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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1003.4991 College and career readiness.—

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high school college and career readiness course that focuses on the transition between high school and college, a trade industry, or military service. The Department of Education shall develop course frameworks and professional development materials

(1) Each school district shall offer students a for-credit

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for the course. Teachers or school counselors who are trained in

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college and career planning shall teach the course, and students in the 11th or 12th grade shall take the course to better

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prepare them for their chosen paths after graduation.

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(2) The course curriculum shall be designed to assist students in postsecondary education and career planning and include the development of a personalized postsecondary

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education and career readiness plan. Each school district shall

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inform parents about the course curriculum and activities.

- (3) Before enrolling in the course and as early as the 9th grade, a student shall be given an interest assessment to measure the student's college and career interests and to aid in determining the student's focus of study. Each school shall hold parent meetings with evening and weekend hours to review a student's interest assessment results and recommend a curriculum plan. The interest assessment and curriculum plan are intended to assist a student with course selections that culminate in readiness to attend college or enter the workforce in a desired field and may not preclude the completion of core requirements for high school graduation. The student, school counselor, and parent shall consent to the student's curriculum plan, developed with the parent's input, before implementation.
- (4) The college and career readiness course curriculum and activities must provide the student with the opportunity to:
- (a) Identify interests and strengths by reviewing the results of the student's interest assessment and curriculum plan.
- (b) Set goals and progress outcomes to be incorporated in the student's final postsecondary education and career plan.
- (c) Research the admission and application requirements for postsecondary educational institutions and complete applications, as appropriate.
 - (d) Research college entrance test requirements.
 - (e) Write personal statements or college entrance letters.
- (f) Review costs associated with postsecondary education while researching state and federal financial aid options, scholarships, and school-based aid to create a financial aid

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action plan.

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- (g) Complete a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program award application and the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and apply for federal work-study options to offset educational costs, as appropriate.
- (h) Learn about personal finance, including credit and credit card debt, savings and investment, and banking and financial services.
- (i) Identify entry-level positions, internships, apprenticeships, and volunteer opportunities for gaining work experience.
 - (j) Write resumes and participate in mock interviews.
- (k) Tour the campuses of local postsecondary educational institutions.
- (1) Finalize a postsecondary education and career readiness plan with a copy given to the parent.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
