Senate Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to waive the payment of all federal taxes until the executive and legislative branches can come to an agreement and pass a resolution to fund the federal budget.

WHEREAS, such shutting down directly and indirectly affects all American citizens and businesses negatively, from those 800,000 government employees who have been furloughed and are not receiving a paycheck, to those commercial enterprises that depend on government employees to purchase goods or pay their bills, and

WHEREAS, the shutting down of government services also results in the suspension of government programs that affect individuals who depend on those programs to carry out their everyday activities, as well as businesses that employ workers who are funded by those programs and all Americans who depend on government programs to conduct regulatory activities that guarantee the health and safety of products in the stream of commerce, and

WHEREAS, all taxpayers are still required to timely pay their federal taxes even though 91 percent of Internal Revenue

Service employees have been furloughed, resulting in the unavailability of tax assistance and the nonpayment of tax refunds, and

WHEREAS, hardworking taxpayers should not be required to pay federally imposed taxes to a government that is unable to provide them with needed services, and

WHEREAS, once the government shutdown is resolved and an agreement is reached to restart services and programs, then, and only then, should individuals and businesses begin to once again pay taxes to the Federal Government, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That as long as the Federal Government is unable to pass a continuing resolution to fund the Federal Government and, therefore, must reduce or discontinue government services, the payment of all federal taxes that become due and are owed during such shutdown should be permanently waived.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
