Remove lines 55-85 and insert:

semester, each Florida College System institution institutions and state university universities shall post prominently in the course registration system and on its website on their websites, as early as is feasible, but at least 14 not less than 30 days before prior to the first day of student registration class for each term, a hyperlink to lists list of each textbook required and recommended textbooks and instructional materials for each course and course section offered at the institution during the upcoming term. The lists posted list must include:

(a) The International Standard Book Number (ISBN) for each

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required and recommended textbook and instructional material.

- (b) For a textbook or instructional material for which an ISBN is not available, textbook or other identifying information, which must include, at a minimum, all of the following: the title, all authors listed, publishers, edition number, copyright date, published date, and other relevant information necessary to identify the specific textbook or instructional material textbooks required and recommended for each course.
- (c) The new and used retail price and the rental price, if applicable, for a required and recommended textbook or instructional material for purchase at the institution's bookstore or other specified vendor, including the website or other contact information for the bookstore.

The State Board of Education and the Board of Governors shall include in the policies, procedures, and guidelines adopted under subsection (5) (4) certain limited exceptions to this notification requirement for courses classes added after the notification deadline. An institution that is unable to comply with this subsection for the 2014 fall semester must provide a quarterly report to the State Board of Education or to the Board of Governors, as applicable, documenting the institution's efforts to be in compliance with this subsection by registration for the 2015 fall semester.

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
