instructors, school district personnel and instructional
personnel, and school sites preparing instructional personnel
through preservice field experience courses and internships
shall meet special requirements. District school boards may pay
student teachers during their internships.

276 scientifically researched, knowledge-based reading literacy and 277 computational skills acquisition, exceptional student education, 278 normal child development, and the disorders of development may 279 be applied toward any specialization area. Credits or points 280 that provide training in the areas of drug abuse, child abuse 281 and neglect, strategies in teaching students having limited 282 proficiency in English, or dropout prevention, or training in areas identified in the educational goals and performance 283 284 standards adopted pursuant to ss. 1000.03(5) and 1008.345 may be 285 applied toward any specialization area. Credits or points earned 286 through approved summer institutes may be applied toward the 287 fulfillment of these requirements. (c) If an applicant wishes to retain more than two specialization areas on the certificate, the applicant shall be permitted two successive validity periods for renewal of all specialization areas, but must earn no fewer than 6 college course credit hours or the equivalent in any one validity period.

(d) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the expanded use of training for renewal of the professional certificate for educators who are required to complete training in teaching students of limited English proficiency <u>or students</u> <u>with disabilities</u> and training in the teaching of reading as follows:

314 1. A teacher who holds a professional certificate may use 315 college credits or inservice points earned through training in 316 teaching students of limited English proficiency or students 317 with disabilities completed in English-for-Speakers-of-Other-318 Languages training and training in the teaching of reading in 319 excess of 6 semester hours during one certificate-validity period toward renewal of the professional certificate during the 320 321 subsequent validity periods.

The department may reinstate an expired professional certificate
