6 Between lines 440 and 441, insert:

7 (3) All services and materials under the Florida Building  
 8 Code Compliance and Mitigation Program must be provided by a  
 9 private, nonprofit corporation under contract with the  
 10 department. The term of the contract shall be for 4 years, with  
 11 the option of one 4-year renewal at the end of the contract  
 12 term. The initial contract must be in effect no later than  
 13 November 1, 2007. The private, nonprofit corporation must be an  
 14 organization whose membership includes trade and professional  
 15 organizations whose members consist primarily of persons and  
 16 entities that are required to comply with the Florida Building  
 17 Code and that are licensed under ~~part XII of chapter 468,~~

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18 chapter 471, chapter 481, or chapter 489. When selecting the  
19 private, nonprofit corporation for the program, the department  
20 must give primary consideration to the corporation's  
21 demonstrated experience and the ability to:

22 (a) Develop and deliver building code-related education,  
23 training, and outreach;

24 (b) Directly access the majority of persons licensed in  
25 the occupations of design, construction, and building code  
26 enforcement individually and through established statewide trade  
27 and professional association networks;

28 (c) Serve as a clearinghouse to deliver education and  
29 outreach throughout the state. The clearinghouse must serve as a  
30 focal point at which persons licensed to design, construct, and  
31 enforce building codes and suppliers and consumers can find each  
32 other in order to exchange information relating to mitigation  
33 and facilitate repairs in the aftermath of a natural disaster;

34 (d) Accept input from the Florida Building Commission,  
35 licensing regulatory boards, local building departments, and the  
36 design and construction industries in order to improve its  
37 education and outreach programs; and

38 (e) Promote design and construction techniques and  
39 materials for mitigating hurricane damage at a Florida-based  
40 trade conference that includes participants from the broadest  
41 possible range of design and construction trades and  
42 professions, including from those private and public sector

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43 entities having jurisdiction over building codes and design and  
44 construction licensure.
