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16	Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 815.04, Florida
17	Statutes, is amended to read:

20	(3)(a) Data, programs, or supporting documentation <u>that</u>
21	<del>which</del> is a trade secret as defined in s. 812.081 <u>, that is held</u>
22	by an agency as defined in chapter 119, and that <del>which</del> resides
23	or exists internal or external to a computer, computer system,
24	<del>or</del> computer network <mark>, or electronic device</mark> <del>which is held by an</del>
25	agency as defined in chapter 119 is confidential and exempt from
26	the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State
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27 Constitution. Whoever willfully, knowingly, and without 28 (b) authorization discloses or takes data, programs, or supporting 29 30 documentation which is a trade secret as defined in s. 812.081 or is confidential as provided by law residing or existing 31 32 internal or external to a computer, computer system, or computer 33 network commits an offense against intellectual property. 34 (C) This subsection is subject to the Open Government 35 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2019, unless reviewed and saved from 36 37 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 38 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 39 necessity that trade secrets and intellectual property be 40 protected from disclosure by persons gaining unauthorized access 41 into computer networks and electronic devices. Trade secrets and 42 intellectual property are already afforded public records 43 exemptions because of the immense importance of this type of 44 proprietary information to the economic competition between this 45 state and other states and nations. As technology continues to 46 evolve, it is important that the existing public records 47 exemption for trade secrets and intellectual property expand 48 accordingly to encompass new technology used in association with 49 sensitive trade secrets and intellectual property. Thus the 50 Legislature declares that it is a public necessity that data, 51 programs, and supporting documentation that are trade secrets 52 which are held by an agency and which reside or exist internal Page 2 of 3

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53	or external to a computer, computer system, computer network, or
54	electronic device be confidential and exempt from the
55	requirements of s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a),
56	Article I of the State Constitution.
57	Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date
58	that HB 641 or similar legislation takes effect, if such
59	legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an
60	extension thereof and becomes a law.

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
