9	documentation of course completion, unless the instructor is not
10	responsible for supervising children in care. As a condition of
11	employment, instructors hired on or after January 1, 2015, must
12	complete this training within 60 days after employment.
13	(d) Each prekindergarten instructor employed by the
14	private prekindergarten provider must be of good moral
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15 character, must <u>undergo background screening pursuant to s.</u> 16 <u>402.305(2)(a)</u> be screened using the level 2 screening standards 17 in s. 435.04 before employment, must be and rescreened at least 18 once every 5 years, must be denied employment or terminated if 19 required under s. 435.06, and must not be ineligible to teach in 20 a public school because his or her educator certificate is 21 suspended or revoked.

22 A private prekindergarten provider may assign a (e) 23 substitute instructor to temporarily replace a credentialed 24 instructor if the credentialed instructor assigned to a 25 prekindergarten class is absent, as long as the substitute 26 instructor meets the requirements of paragraph (d) is of good 27 moral character and has been screened before employment in 28 accordance with level 2 background screening requirements in 29 chapter 435. The Office of Early Learning shall adopt rules to 30 implement this paragraph which shall include required 31 qualifications of substitute instructors and the circumstances 32 and time limits for which a private prekindergarten provider may assign a substitute instructor. 33

(f) Each of the private prekindergarten provider's prekindergarten classes must be composed of at least 4 students but may not exceed 20 students. In order to protect the health and safety of students, each private prekindergarten provider must also provide appropriate adult supervision for students at all times and, for each prekindergarten class composed of 12 or more students, must have, in addition to a prekindergarten

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instructor who meets the requirements of paragraph (c), at least 41 one adult prekindergarten instructor who is not required to meet 42 43 those requirements but who must meet each requirement of s. 44 402.305(2) paragraph (d). This paragraph does not supersede any 45 requirement imposed on a provider under ss. 402.301-402.319. 46 (g) Beginning January 1, 2016, the private prekindergarten provider must employ child care personnel who hold a high school 47 48 diploma or its equivalent and are at least 18 years of age, 49 unless the personnel are not responsible for supervising

50 <u>children in care or are under direct supervision.</u>

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
