22	Section 1. Section 471.007, Florida Statutes, is amended

26 Professional Engineers. The board shall consist of 11 members, 27 nine of whom shall be licensed engineers and two of whom shall 28 be laypersons who are not and have never been engineers or 29 members of any closely related profession or occupation. A 30 member of the board who is a licensed engineer must be selected 31 and appointed based on his or her qualifications to provide 32 expertise and experience to the board at all times in civil engineering; structural engineering; electrical or electronic 33 34 engineering; mechanical engineering; or engineering education. 35 Of the members who are licensed engineers, three shall be civil 36 engineers, one shall be a structural engineer, one shall be 37 either an electrical or electronic engineer, one shall be a mechanical engineer, one shall be an industrial engineer, one 38 39 shall be an engineering educator, and one shall be from any 40 discipline of engineering other than civil engineering. 41 (2) Following expiration of the terms of members appointed 42 to initiate staggered terms as set forth in subsection (3), 43 members of the board Members shall be appointed by the Governor 44 for terms of 4 years each. A professional or technical engineering society may submit a list of qualified nominees to 45 46 be considered by the Governor for appointment. 47 When the terms of members serving as of July 1, 2014, (3) expire, the terms of their immediate successors shall be 48 49 staggered so that three members are appointed for 2 years, four members are appointed for 3 years, and four members are 50

51 appointed for 4 years, as determined by the Governor. Each 52 member shall hold office until the expiration of his or her 53 appointed term or until a successor has been appointed. 54 Section 2. Paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of section 55 471.013, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 56 471.013 Examinations; prerequisites.-57 (1)Every applicant who is qualified to take the 58 (e) 59 fundamentals examination or the principles and practice examination shall be allowed to take either examination three 60 times, notwithstanding the number of times either examination 61 62 has been previously failed. If an applicant fails either 63 examination three times, the board shall require the applicant to complete additional college-level education courses or a 64 65 board-approved relevant examination review course as a condition 66 of future eligibility to take that examination. If the applicant 67 is delayed in taking the examination due to reserve or active duty service in the United States Armed Forces or National 68 69 Guard, the applicant is allowed an additional two attempts to 70 take the examination before the board may require additional college-level education or review courses. 71 72 Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 73 471.015, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 74 471.015 Licensure.-75 (5) (a) The board shall deem that an applicant who seeks

76 licensure by endorsement has passed an examination substantially 77 equivalent to the fundamentals examination when such applicant 78 has:

79 1. Has held a valid professional engineer's license in 80 another state for 15 years and has had 20 years of continuous 81 professional-level engineering experience;

82 2. Has received a doctorate degree in engineering from an 83 institution that has an undergraduate engineering degree program 84 which is accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering 85 Technology; or

86 3. Has received a doctorate degree in engineering and has 87 taught engineering full time for at least 3 years, at the 88 baccalaureate level or higher, after receiving that degree.

Section 4. Effective March 1, 2015, subsection (3) of
section 471.017, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

471.017 Renewal of license.-

92 (3) (a) The board shall require a demonstration of 93 continuing professional competency of engineers as a condition 94 of license renewal or relicensure. Every licensee must complete 95 <u>9 continuing education</u> <u>4 professional development hours</u>, for 96 each year of the license renewal period, totaling 18 continuing 97 <u>education hours for the license renewal period</u>. For each renewal 98 period for such continuing education:<u>-</u>4

99 <u>1. One hour must hours shall</u> relate to this chapter and
100 the rules adopted under this chapter.

108	Continuing education hours may be earned by presenting or
109	attending seminars, in-house or nonclassroom courses, workshops,
110	or professional or technical presentations made at meetings,
111	webinars, conventions, or conferences, including those presented
112	by vendors with specific knowledge related to the licensee's
113	area of practice. Up to 4 hours may be earned by serving as an
114	officer or actively participating on a committee of a board-
115	recognized professional or technical engineering society. The 2
116	required continuing education hours relating to this chapter,
117	the rules adopted pursuant to this chapter, and ethics may be
118	earned by serving as a member of the Legislature or as an
119	elected state or local official. The hours required pursuant to

126 multijurisdictional licensees for the purpose of avoiding 127 proprietary continuing professional competency requirements and 128 shall allow nonclassroom hours to be credited. The board may, by 129 rule, exempt from continuing professional competency requirements retired professional engineers who no longer sign 130 131 and seal engineering documents and licensees in unique circumstances that severely limit opportunities to obtain the 132 133 required continuing education professional development hours. 134 Section 5. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this 135 act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
