588	universities shall interface institutional advising systems with
589	the statewide computer-assisted student advising system. At a

639	the University of West Florida shall submit a report to the

644	the services and functions of the program.
645	(6) The Northwest Regional Data Center established

It is intended that articulated acceleration serve 707 to shorten the time necessary for a student to complete the 708 requirements associated with the conference of a high school 709 diploma and a postsecondary degree, broaden the scope of 710 curricular options available to students, or increase the depth 711 of study available for a particular subject.
