A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Florida Ethics Center; establishing the mission and duties of the center; creating the Florida Ethics Center within the Office of Chief Inspector General in the Executive Office of the Governor; requiring that the center be located in the Capitol Complex; providing for appropriations; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the viability and vitality of our constitutional form of government, the beacon of hope for many people throughout many generations, requires a steadfast adherence to the principles of honesty, integrity, truth, trust, and transparency in public service for the good of our citizens, and

WHEREAS, our representative democracy cannot endure without the engagement of the people with their elected officials, and

WHEREAS, civil engagement is fostered by goodwill, honesty, and transparency, must be free from corrupting conflicts of interest and self-dealing, and must nurture deep understanding of the responsibilities of public service, and

WHEREAS, Florida, as one of the largest, most diverse, and prosperous states, has the opportunity and responsibility to lead within the ranks of the United States, and

WHEREAS, there must be a concerted effort to forge a path to a higher level of ethical leadership and stewardship of public trust and restore trust in government to the people of

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this great state, and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of state government to make government honest, transparent, uncorrupted, and free from undue influence as evidenced by the very existence of the offices of inspectors general, the Commission on Ethics, cases brought by state attorneys, and the many laws, rules, and regulations developed throughout the years to address illegal and unethical activity in government, and

WHEREAS, knowledge, study, robust debate, and the contemplation of issues helps to create the sunshine of understanding and truth and can make changes in attitudes, approach, and actions that cannot be done by law and its process alone, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) This act may be cited as the "Florida Ethics Center Act."

- (2) The mission of the Florida Ethics Center is to help elected officials, those seeking office, and others who interact with government to have the opportunity to study applied ethics and the impact of conflicts of interest and examine issues that will help disseminate a deep understanding of ethics as they are applied to government, to business interests, and for the good of the state and its people.
  - (3) The Florida Ethics Center shall:

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(a) Train and educate candidates and elected and appointed officials in state and local government about ethics issues that arise in government, the relationships among business interests, and issues that promote the public good.

- (b) Be available to other states and their local governments as a training, education, and study center. This will allow Florida to emerge as a leader among the states in good and ethical government practice and would offset the costs of operating the center.
- (c) Fund two resident scholar positions selected from preeminent universities in this state.
- (d) Fund three rotating positions for ethics scholars from state colleges and universities.
- (e) Fund visiting scholars and lecturers who periodically make presentations on ethical issues.
- (f) Fund and produce an online newsletter and journal to disseminate applied ethics and civic engagement knowledge and to encourage study, discussion, and debate. The costs of producing these publications may be offset by subscription income derived from entities and individuals beyond state and local governments.
- (g) Fund and create an annual national and international conference on government ethics.
- (h) Provide for the distribution of pamphlets, training materials, and online training for the use of elected officials and candidates of this state and other states to train and learn

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about government and applied ethics. The proceeds raised from selling materials or offering online or traditional courses to entities outside of this state may be used to offset the costs of the production of materials and for the benefit of the Florida Ethics Center.

- (i) Provide for adequate staffing and supervision of the center's functions.
- (4) The Florida Ethics Center is created within the Office of Chief Inspector General in the Executive Office of the Governor. It shall be prominently situated within the Capitol Complex to take advantage of the Capitol location for simulated training sessions. The center shall be designated with clear signage for easy location and for recognition as an integral part of the Capitol Complex.
- (5) The Florida Ethics Center shall be funded annually by the Legislature.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
