21	(b) "Personnel" means all owners, operators, employees,													
22	and volunteers working in a summer day camp or summer 24-hour													
23	camp who may be employed by or perform volunteer work for a													
24	person, corporation, or agency that operates a summer day camp													
25	or summer 24-hour camp.													
26	(c) "Screening" means the act of assessing the background

40	(2)(a) The department shall create a uniform, statewide
41	identification badge to be worn by summer camp personnel
42	signifying that the person has met the level 2 screening
43	requirements of chapter 435. The department shall issue the
44	identification badge, which must bear a photograph of the
45	person. An identification badge shall be issued if the person:
46	1. Is a resident and citizen of the United States or a
47	permanent resident alien of the United States as determined by
48	the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services.

51	(b) The uniform, statewide identification badge must be

53 camp grounds. 54 (c) The identification badge shall be valid for 5 years or 55 until the person terminates employment or is terminated or until 56 the volunteer ceases working at the summer camp. Within 48 hours 57 after termination or ceasing to volunteer, the person shall 58 return the identification badge to the operator of the summer 59 camp. 60 (d) The department shall determine a uniform cost that a 61 summer camp may charge for the identification badge, which shall 62 be borne by the recipient of the badge. 63 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
